Leadership Redding has never been stronger than it is today as evidenced by a recap of various program elements over the past year.

Graduation – Class of 2007



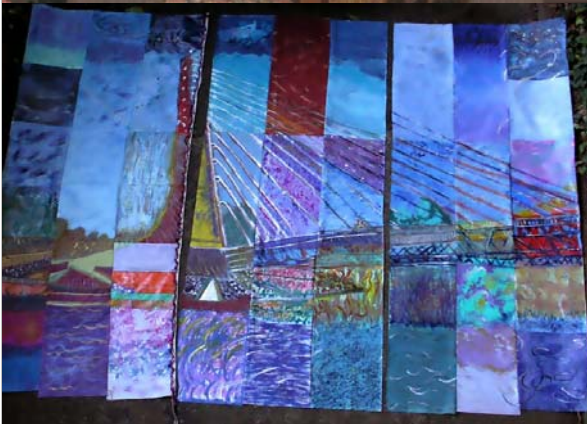
